Reading Mark 10:13-31

And they were bringing children to him that he might touch them, and the disciples rebuked them. But when Jesus saw it, he was indignant and said to them, "Let the children come to me; do not hinder them, for to such

belongs the kingdom of God. Truly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it." And he took them in his arms and blessed them, laying his hands on them. And as he was setting out on his journey, a man ran up and knelt before him and asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" And Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good except God alone. You know the commandments: 'Do not murder, Do not commit adultery, Do not steal, Do not bear false witness, Do not defraud, Honor your father and mother." And he said to him, "Teacher, all these I have kept from my youth." And Jesus, looking at him, loved him, and said to him, "You lack one thing: go, sell all that you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me." Disheartened by the saying, he went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions. And Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How difficult it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" And the disciples were amazed at his words. But Jesus said to them again, "Children, how difficult it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of God." And they were exceedingly astonished, and said to him, "Then who can be saved?" Jesus looked at them and said, "With man it is impossible, but not with God. For all things are possible with God." Peter began to say to him, "See, we have left everything and followed you." Jesus said, "Truly, I say to you, there is no one who

has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands, for my sake and for the gospel, who will not receive a hundredfold now in this time, houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions, and in the age to come eternal life. But many who are first will be last, and the last first."

Devotional Message from Pastor Thompson

Our reading today from the Gospel of Mark, Chapter 10, teaches on blessing. Blessing means "favor". To have someone's blessing is to have someone's favor. It means that they are on your side, that they hope good for you, that they pray you prosper and that things go well for you. To have someone's blessing is to have their approval and favor.

Today we need God's favor. Am I right? Yes, I am right. Today we need God's favor. We need his blessing.

We are living in challenging times, when fear and uncertainty surround us. Our President and our Governor are concerned for our safety as a community and they are prescribing drastic measures to keep us safe. Our schools have been closed for one week and our church won't be having services for the next two Sundays. All to avoid

spreading a dangerous virus. This is scary stuff; especially for children. And although we are wise to follow the guidance of the government and take all precautions, now is not the time to give in to the temptation to fear or panic. There is no need to panic or fear.

God is still our Father. His Son Jesus Christ is still our Savior. The Holy Spirit is still among us. And although we might not be together for a few Sundays, our church is still our church.

And the blessing of God and of his Son Jesus Christ is still ours. We have God's blessing in Jesus Christ.

When the crowds brought their children to Jesus so that he might touch them and bless them, the disciples rebuked the crowds and told them that Jesus was too busy for them and had no interest in them. But it was not true. Jesus saw what the disciples were doing and he rebuked them and he invited the children to come close so that he could touch them and bless them.

He does the same for us today. Jesus invites us to come to him in our time of need and to receive his blessing. When we pray he hears us. He is our source of blessing and favor in a dangerous world and always will be.

So let us trust in Jesus during these difficult days. Amen.
